SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1 Organising Authority

1.1 The Organising Authority is Loch Venachar Sailing Club (LVSC) in association with Sailability Scotland SCIO.

2 Rules

- 2.1 The regatta will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), the prescriptions of the RYA, the Challenger Class Rules and LVSC local rules, as amended by these Sailing Instructions. LVSC Club rules 8 and 9 will apply at all times namely:
 - Except in the vicinity of the Club site all sailing boats must keep clear of fishing boats and shore fishermen.
 - Boats may not be beached, other than at the club site, except in an emergency or by prior permission.
- 2.2 All Challengers must have a grab line of free specification fixed to each sponson and a tow line of free specification fixed to the bow and long enough to be led back to the cockpit and handled by the sailor.

A Challenger Hull is defined thus - "A boat's Hull shall consist of a central main hull, plus left and right-hand sponsons bolted together with two aluminium tubular crossbeams".

Racing Rules will be changed as follows:

- 2.3 Rule 27.1 & 40, Personal Buoyancy shall be worn at all times whilst on the water or pontoons.
- 2.4 Rule 41, outside help is modified to permit a boat to receive outside help from a safety boat for any reason other than added propulsion.
- 2.5 Rule 44.1, taking a penalty modified from two turns to one turn for RRS Part 2 infringements
- 2.6 Rule 49, crew position modified so that helm and buddy should remain seated in their normal positions within the main hull or on a buddy seat except in an emergency.

3 Notices to Competitors

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located in the clubhouse.

4 Changes to Sailing Instructions

4.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted on the noticeboard at least 1 hour before the warning signal on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 16.00 on the day before it will take effect.

5 Signals made Ashore

- 5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed at the clubhouse
- 5.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with '15 minutes' in the "Race Signals, AP" Rule.

6 Schedule of Races

- 6.1 Racing will take place on Saturday 23rd April and Sunday 24th April 2022
- 6.2 Registration
 Competitors may register at LVSC clubhouse from 09.00hrs.

6.3 Schedule

Briefing will be at 10.00hrs.

The event will be a five race regatta held over two days

Back to back races should have the approval of all the sailors.

7 Class Flag

7.1 The Challenger Class Flag will be - (Laser) Flag



8 Racing Area

8.1 The racing area will be the area in front of the clubhouse

9 The Course

9.1 Course(s) for each race will be as described at the sailors briefing and displayed on the course board not later than 10 minutes before the first warning signal.

10 Marks

- 10.1 Marks will be described and on display on the notice board.
- 10.2 Committee and patrol boats will be described on the notice board if applicable.

11 The Start

- 11.1 Races will be started using rule 26 (i.e. 5, 4, 1, go) warning signal 5 minutes before the starting signal. Times shall be taken from the visual light signals on the clubhouse balcony. The failure of a sound signal shall be disregarded.
- 11.2 The Starting Line will run through the signal mast (a white pole on the clubhouse balcony) and the transit pole flying a Club burgee on the shore. Its outer end will be limited by an outer distance mark. This is a limit mark at the start but may not be exactly on the line.
- 11.3 An alternative start line may be set by the race officer if wind conditions make this desirable and will be communicated to competitors at the briefing.

12 The Finish

12.1 The finish line will be between the signal mast and the outer mark. Flag S displayed at the clubhouse balcony means finish at the finishing line.

13 Time Limit

13.1 The target time for the leading boat to complete each race is 45 minutes. There will be no time limit for boats' finishing after the first boat has finished but in order to minimise excessive delays between races, the race officer may award a finishing position to those slower boats that are still racing. The race officer's decision is final and will not provide grounds for a competitor to seek redress. This changes rule 62.

14 Protests

- 14.1 The Exoneration Penalty (and the Advisory Hearing and RYA Arbitration Procedures) of the RYA Rules Disputes Procedures will be available and a summary will be posted on the Official Notice Board. The penalty will be a loss of a minimum two places but shall not result in a score worse than DNF.
- 14.2 If a protest is preferred, forms are available at the race office. Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered there within the appropriate time limit.
- 14.3 The protest limit is 60 minutes after the last boat has finished the last race of the day.
- 14.4 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or witnesses. Location of hearings will be identified on the notice.

15 Scoring

- 15.1 The scoring system to be used will be as in RRS Appendix A using the Low Point system.
- 15.2 Two races are required to be completed to constitute a series
- 15.3 When up to 3 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores
- 15.4 When 4 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 15.5 Race results will be scored in overall finishing order regardless of fleet. Gold, Silver and Bronze Fleet results may be extracted for prize giving purposes they shall be extracted from overall results and not scored separately.

16 Declarations

16.1 Boats retiring must inform the race office on coming ashore.

17 Radio Communication

17.1 Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

18 Prizes

18.1 Awards will be made to 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each fleet. A prize will also be given to the winner of the Helpers Race.

19 Visual Image Consent

Competitors automatically grant the Organising Authority without payment the right in perpetuity to make, use and show any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or filmed television of, or relating to, the Regatta, unless the Authority is advised otherwise in writing prior to the Regatta.

20 Disclaimer of Liability

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 3, Decision to Race and also the disclaimers on the Notice of Race and Entry Form. The organising authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

21 Insurance

The boat is required to hold adequate insurance and in particular to hold insurance against third party claims in the sum of at least £3,000,000.
